

WHAT IS ADVANCED COLLEGE CREDIT?

Also known as dual credit, advanced college credit allows high school students to complete college coursework while still in high school. Courses are taught at the student's high school, by high school instructors certified to teach college coursework. Students who take 1818 credit:

1. Save Time

Taking college classes early means more room in your college schedule for opportunities such as studying abroad, double majoring, graduating early, or just having a lighter courseload.

2. Save Money

The standard 1818 course costs \$225. Compared to a traditional college course, that's an average savings of \$1,300.

3. Earn Highly Transferable Credit

1818 Credit is widely accepted by universities and colleges nationwide.

4. Become College Ready

Students that participate in the 1818 Program feel more prepared for the demands of college-level coursework.

WHAT SETS 1818 APART FROM AP OR IB?

Unlike AP or IB, there is no formal examination conducted at the end of an 1818 course. Upon completion of a course, each 1818 student receives a grade on an official Saint Louis University transcript, which they may send to any university.

HOW TRANSFERABLE IS 1818 CREDIT?

Exploring how other institutions accept dual-credit is an important step in planning your academic journey. While 1818 is highly transferable, it's important to research in advance how the 1818 Program aligns with your higher-ed goals.



If you are planning to study at SLU: Grades earned through the 1818 Program are considered SLU grades and will become part of your undergraduate GPA if you enroll as a full-time student.



If you are planning to study elsewhere: 1818 credit is recognized as Saint Louis University credit and is widely transferable to many colleges and universities. It's important to note that most institutions require a minimum grade of C for transfer eligibility. Additionally, highly selective institutions or specialized degree programs may not accept 1818 credits, or may only accept them as gen. ed. credits.



If you are planning to earn a degree in medicine: Institutions (including SLU) may not accept 1818 credits.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE?

While our program is primarily open to juniors and seniors with a GPA 3.0 or higher, sophomores with a 3.5 GPA in sequenced courses in computer science, math, and world languages are eligible to participate.
