Father Michael Barber Undergraduate International Service Learning Award

The Barber International Service Learning Award honors former Dean Michael Barber, S.J.'s steadfast support of the Jesuit mission to engage in service and learning at a global level. Current undergraduate students engaged in an international service project can apply for up to \$500 for expenses such as travel, lodging or project costs.

Eligible undergraduates must be majoring in a discipline within the College of Arts and Sciences and can only receive the award once per academic year. Students will fill out a brief application and attach a PDF proposal. Proposals must include your:

- Name, email address and phone number
- Academic department
- Faculty mentor's name and email
- Faculty and chair approval of the project (two signatures)
- Project description in 500 words or less
- Travel destination
- Travel dates
- Itemized budget and the amount of any matching funds from your department

We recommend that you work closely with a faculty mentor in preparing a proposal, which must include the signature of your major's departmental chair or program director.

The associate dean for diversity, equity, inclusion, and engagement administers the fund for this award. Applications are judged on the feasibility and impact of the project, its educational value and the availability of matching funds from the applicant's department and/or other sources.
