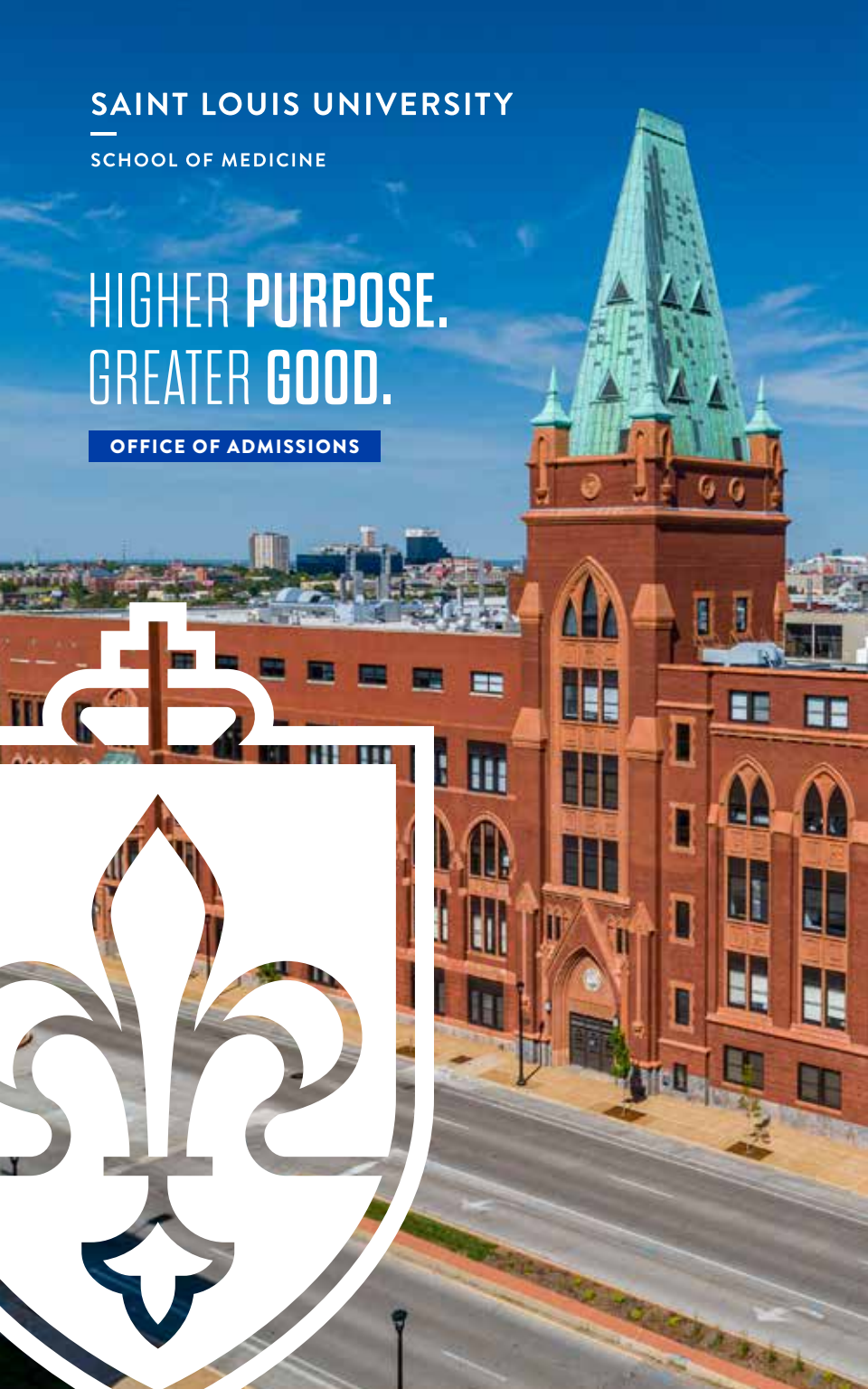

Basic Science

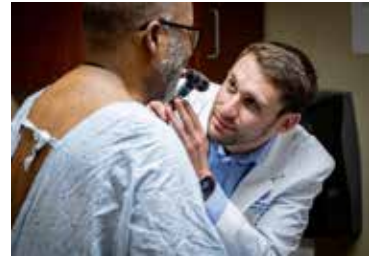
Health System Sciences

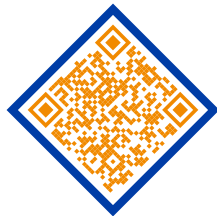
