

#### **Use of Assessment Data**

 How and when will analyzed data be used by program faculty to make changes in pedagogy, curriculum design, and/or assessment practices? Data from learning assessments and student feedback (written and verbal) are used at the end of each course to identify areas of strength and weakness. These data are reviewed in an annual process for each course in the core curriculum. Faculty, course directors, students, and the academic deans in the Office of Curricular Affairs participate in this process administered through the Program Evaluation and Assessment Subcommittee, the Pre-Clerkship Curriculum Subcommittee, and the Clinical Curriculum Subcommittee.

Gaps in the curriculum are identified through several means. The Curriculum Inventory is a mapping process managed by the Association of American

Medical Colleges (AAMC) and run annually. The resulting report identifies the links between program objectives, course objectives, individual session objectives, instructional methods, assessment methods and resources. This is a robust tool used by our curriculum committees. Additional AAMC data from student surveys (the Year 2 Questionnaire and the Graduation Questionnaire) provide student insights into the curriculum as a whole.

Exam data are reviewed immediately following each exam by the director of assessment and the course directors. In years 1 and 2 questions that do not perform well (for both in-house and NBME exams) are thrown out. New questions for our in-house exams are written by our faculty and reviewed by both the director of assessment and the associate dean for pre-clerkship curriculum. NBME exams in years 3 and 4 are nationally-normed exams and are not subject to our review or modification. The NBME itself makes any changes that they deem necessary to maintain the quality of these exams.

2. How and when will the program faculty evaluate the impact of assessment-informed changes made in previous years?

The evaluation process described above is iterative. For example, issues brought forth for a course in AY 20-21 are reviewed again in AY 21-22 to see if they have been resolved or continue to be concerns. Assessments which do not perform well, such as an objective structured clinical examination (OSCE) in a year 3 clerkship are reviewed by the director of the clinical skills center in concert with the clerkship directors. Student feedback also plays a role in improving these assessments. All of this work happens on an annual basis.

1. On what schedule/cycle will program faculty assess each of the program's student learning outcomes? (Please note: It is <u>not recommended</u> to try to assess every outcome every year.)

The Program Evaluation and Assessment Subcommittee is charged (by the LCME, Standard 8, Element 8.3 Curricular Design, Review, Revision/Content Monitoring) with the annual review of the SOM program objectives and their mapping to the Physician Competency Reference Set (PCRS). This subcommittee reviews the objectives, suggests any changes, and assures that each objective is appropriately mapped to the PCRS. The completed review is then forwarded to the Curriculum Committee, chaired by the Senior Associate Dean for Undergraduate Medical Education. This committee reviews the objectives, mapping and gives final approval to any changes. The last review and approval of the SOM Educational Program Objectives was April 21, 2021.

2. Describe how, and the extent to which, program faculty contributed to the development of this plan.

Course directors map their course objectives to the educational program objectives (EPOs) of the MD Degree Program. They design and manage their assessments, and map these to their course objectives. Staff in the Office of Curricular Affairs assist faculty with this work. These data are entered into OASIS (software used by the SOM) and the data in the tables above are pulled from OASIS. The director of curriculum management provides oversight of the mapped data and reviews it for accuracy.

## Year 1 and Year 3

Rubrics used in several first and second-year courses are included in the attached zip file. These courses also use both in-house (Exam - Institutionally Developed,

Written/Computer-based) and National Board of Medical Examiners (NBME) assessments (Exam - Nationally Normed/Standardized, Subject) that are administered by the NBME online. We do not have copies of NBME exams.

#### Year 3 and Year 4

Also included in the zip file is an example of a student performance evaluation (Clinical Performance Rating/Checklist) that is used in all seven core clerkships (FCM-301, IM-301, N-301, OB-301, PED-301, PS-301, S-301). Each of these clerkships has its own set of other assessment tools, specific to their discipline. In total, there are perhaps at least 50 different assessment tools in years 3 and 4. If copies are needed, they can be provided. In addition, each clerkship has their own multiple-choice assessments (Exam - Institutionally Developed, Written/Computer-based) and National Board of Medical Examiners (NBME) assessments (Exam - Nationally Normed/Standardized, Subject) which are administered by the NBME online. We do not have copies of these. Two forms from Year 4–IM-451–are included: the student performance evaluation and the chart review.
