



## Missouri Voters’ Public Opinion: Issue Priorities and Ratings

The following document summarizes the opinions of likely voters in Missouri on issue priorities and ratings of conditions. These results were gathered via SLU/YouGov Poll surveys conducted between 2020 and 2024, and the queried conditions included the economy, schools, crime, race relations, infrastructure, and respondents’ health. The SLU/YouGov Poll is a biannual survey of likely Missouri voters aiming to inform policymakers, citizens, and researchers of Missourians’ opinions on important issues facing the state.

Over Time Summary: Among likely Missouri voters, most consistently rate both the U.S. and Missouri economies as Fair or Poor from 2020-2024. Over that same period, respondents indicated that the economy should be the top priority of Missouri State Government. Eight percent fewer respondents rated schools as Excellent or Good from June 2020 to February 2024. Ratings of crime, infrastructure and roads, and race relations have remained more consistent.
